POSTING POLICY

We invite everyone to participate in the conversations on the DriveERT social media sites but ask all to follow a few simple rules to ensure these sites remain factual and constructive platforms for informed dialogue.

If we determine you are in conflict with any of the following posting policies, we will remove your comment. If you continue to violate our policies, we will ban you from our social media sites.

INAPPROPRIATE LANGUAGE OR CONTENT

DriveERT's social media sites are a place to engage in factual and constructive discussions about the Elizabeth River Tunnels. Please keep your comments and discussion postings factual, on topic, rated PG-13, spam free and appropriate for a mixed audience.

PHOTOS AND VIDEOS

Please make sure that you have permission to use and distribute any videos or photos that you post. Just because you found the image or video on the Internet, doesn't mean you have the right to post it.

INSULTS AND HARASSMENT

Disagreeing with us or someone else in a constructive, thoughtful, well-reasoned manner is not only welcomed, but encouraged. However, we take unconstructive, threatening, toxic, profane or generally abusive comments very seriously and will delete any such posts and ban anyone who repeatedly engages in this behavior.

Posts of cartoons, memes or other content created to disparage or insult people or companies will be removed immediately.

PERSONAL INFORMATION

We do not allow personal information about anyone to be posted on our social media sites. Doing so will result in immediate removal of the post. Repeat offenders will be banned. If you need to send us someone's information, please do so via private message or email.

IF YOU'VE BEEN BANNED FROM OUR NETWORK

If you've been banned or had a comment deleted by us and you think it is in error, please let us know via private message or email. We'll always take another look at the specific case and respond at least once to your concerns.

Unfortunately, we aren't able to publicly handle appeals or articulate reasons for banning someone. These topics tend to devolve into unconstructive exchanges. As a result, we'll remove discussions and posts asking for a public comment.
